Overview

A real-time, online checklist program, eBird has revolutionized the way that the birding community reports and accesses information about birds. Launched in 2002 by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, eBird provides rich data sources for basic information on bird abundance and distribution at a variety of spatial and temporal scales. eBird's goal is to maximize the utility and accessibility of the vast numbers of bird observations made each year by recreational and professional bird watchers. It is amassing one of the largest fastest growing biodiversity data resources in existence. For example, in March 2012, participants reported more than 3.1 million bird observations across North Americal

On the way up, a very busy Hairy Woodpecker was vigorously tapping on a downed log. He just glanced at us as we walked within ten feet of him. Our return trip included a stop at the junction of Wolf Lodge and Beauty Bay where we identified ten Common Loons.

Rathdrum Prairie Raptor Run - 2014-15"

"Janet Callen, Shirley Sturts, and Doug Ward conducted the first raptor survey of the season out on the Rathdrum

Prairie on Saturday, November 15th, 2014. This survey, also called a "Raptor Run", is our contribution to a broad, regional survey that collects observations from about 250 routes throughout Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and parts of Northern California to document hawk, eagle, and falcon densities and movements during the winter months. This month's totals are summarized below:

Species	11/15/14	11/16/13
Northern Harrier	-	4
Red-tailed Hawk	26	16
Rough-legged Hawk	7	6
Buteo (species)	2	2
American Kestrel	2	2
Total Individuals	37	30
Total Raptors/Mile	0.86	0.69

So as you can see, it was a fairly successful day compared to last year. In addition to the raptors, the group also recorded other

species including California Quail, Rock Pigeon, Eurasian Collared-Dove (+60!),

Mourning Dove, Northern Flicker, Black-billed Magpie, Common Raven, American Robin, European Starling, Red-winged Blackbird (late), House Finch, and House Sparrow.



The observations of each participant join those of others in an international network of eBird users. eBird then shares these observations with a global community of educators, land managers, ornithologists, and conservation biologists. In time these data will become the foundation for a better understanding of bird distribution across the western hemisphere and beyond.
